- Have you wondered how visiting Exhorters were arranged at your ecclesia?
- The long term impacts of COVID and the aging of our Ecclesial membership has impacted on the numbers of Exhorters available to visit other Ecclesias.
- Please consider joining the Inter-Ecclesial Speaking Plan.

There are good reasons to be involved, including:

- You can share your blessing of encouragement with other ecclesias and especially amongst smaller ecclesias that need some extra help and support.
- You can get to know Christ's family in other locations a little better, creating connections and putting faces to names.
- You can use an existing exhortation on a new audience.

You may ask, if I join in, how much control do I have over appointments that I may receive? You have considerable control. You can decide upon:

- Which ecclesias you are available to visit (you may have travel constraints or there may be families that you want to catch up with).
- When you are available to speak (you set the dates that you are available for).
- You wont miss out on important dates at your ecclesia as they should be listed when you set your available dates.
- You set your maximum number of possible appointments that you want for each plan period.
- You can easily have a break; just set zero for your maximum number of possible appointments. There is nothing else to do. This stays set as zero until you are ready for visiting again via the Speaking Plan.
- You can also describe to all Ecclesial Planners if you are only available for online exhorts if the travel distance to some ecclesias is too great.

Your Ecclesial Planner can also control (amongst other things):

 How close Exhorter appointments can follow each other (i.e. number of weeks between your appointments).
